Salem Willows Park is located at the easterly end of the city of Salem.

It is visited by thousands every summer and is one of the few parks on the Atlantic Coast that is easily accessible to the public.

Northerly, across the water, the Beverly Shore with its many fine residences may be seen. Cape Ann is to the northeast. Directly seaward may be seen Great and Little Misery Islands. Baker's Island with its lighthouse and red and white revolving light, and several smaller islands. Looking toward the south one may see Marblehead and old Fort Miller.

The beautiful European White Willow Trees in Salem Willows Park which provide shade for the thousands of visitors every year were planted in 1801 and it is from them that the park received its name. Nine of the original forty trees planted are still standing.

Nearby is the largest swimming pool on the Atlantic seaboard. It is known as the J. C. B. Smith Memorial Pool. It was built with funds left by the late J. C. B. Smith, a resident of Salem Willows, together with funds furnished by a Federal project.

Opposite the swimming pool is Fort Lee on which four guns were mounted for the protection of the approaches to the harbor during the War of the Rebellion.

Fort Pickering is on Winter Island nearby the pool. This island was occupied by soldiers during the Wars of 1812 and 1815. During the Civil War six guns were mounted on the island for the protection of Salem Harbor. A portion of Winter Island is now occupied as an air port by the United States Government Coast Guard Service.
