prisoner of war lecture, & 2 of the speakers
were wounded American soldiers. They

had been exchanged for German prisoners,
because of their wounds. Both boys were
in the same prison camp as Dick. *

The complement at Sampson finally
warranted me the opportunity to take the

exam. for 2nd Class. So it means I can wear one more stripe now.

This has really been a rugged winter at Sampson — we have been snowbound several times.
