President's Message

In writing a message to the Senior Class I would like to request that you think with me concerning Salem's past and Salem's future — your future.

In 1854 Salem Normal School was founded as a two-year normal school. The building still stands as a monument to the pioneers of teacher education in the United States. The old Normal School survived a terrible civil war that all but destroyed our great republic. In 1896 the so-called New Normal School was constructed in South Salem at the corner of Loring Avenue and Lafayette Street. At the New Normal School, then the latest in buildings for teacher education, the curriculum was expanded to three years. New ideas in teacher education and practice were introduced. From our present College building and Horace Mann Training School have gone forth to teach thousands of young people imbued with the spirit of service above self and with faith in the meaning of the college motto, "Progredi".

As students at Salem you have seen the college curriculum and physical plant begin to grow further to meet new demands of the changing world of education. Before the next college year becomes history, the long-awaited new construction will become a functional part of the College. During your college years you dreamed of its advent to meet the great need especially in facilities of the library, gymnasium, auditorium and cafeteria. You shared with the administration the pleasure of seeing construction begun, and into your memories will go the picture of cement and structural steel in the Spring of 1958. You are most heartily invited to return to the College often to use its facilities as alumni, in educational advancement and in social affairs.

In completing four years of study for the degree of bachelor of science in education you have taken the first step into the field of teaching. Now that you have begun the quest for knowledge let it be a life-long endeavor; throughout your professional life give your best efforts to your work and seek always to deepen and increase your knowledge.

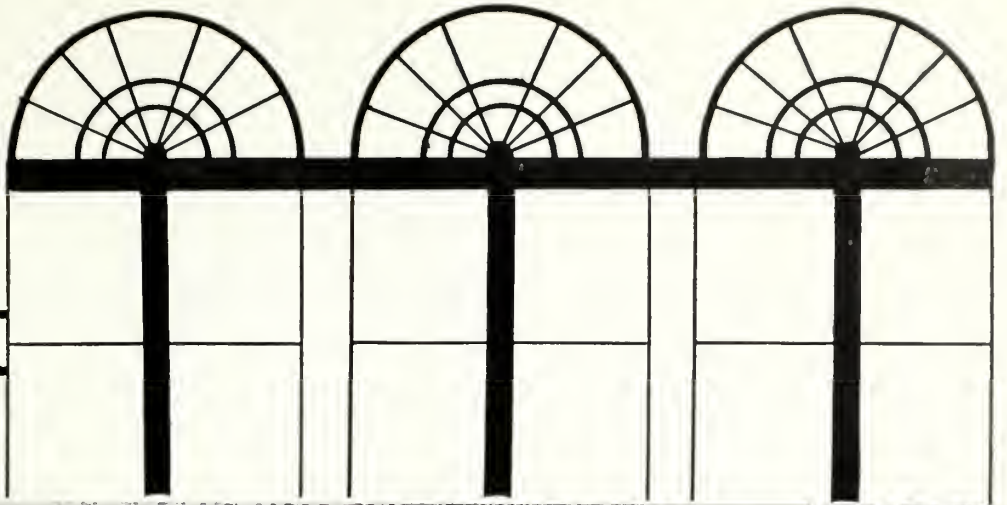

On the Architect's Table

*"When we mean to build,
We first survey the plot, then draw the model;
And when we see the figure of the house,
Then must we rate the cost of the erection."*

The development of an individual, like the construction of a building, is a difficult and involved process. A building must have many elements in certain proportions in order to make it safe and able to serve its purpose. In the development of an individual many elements must also be included. Thus it was that President Meier, the head architect of Salem Teachers College made sure that there were staff members fully capable of adding to and completing the two hundred and thirty-six unfinished outlines that were put before them on September 13, 1954. President Meier called together these staff members of the Junior High, Elementary, and Business departments and made the assignments. The assignments were received with enthusiasm, for the two hundred and thirty-six sketches, varying widely in structure and background, now put on the drafting boards presented a fascinating challenge. The staff put their heads together and decided that it would be necessary to do much work on these new specimens, shading them in with much knowledge and outlining them with a professional attitude. A great undertaking, and a great beginning for the Class of 1958.

Shortly after we were put on the drafting boards, some newly completed sketches tried to erase us by putting us through a series of rigorous ordeals classified as Initiation. Beanies were drawn on our heads, and signs indicating our squareness were added to us, back and front. We were drawn with heavy lead, however, and these erasers could not even make a smudge. Our tormentors were still dissatisfied, so we had to prove our talents further by performing for them at a banquet held in our honor on October 7. Because of our magnificent performances, the architects were told to erase our beanies and signs, and we were officially recognized as the Freshman Class of Salem Teachers College.

Immediately after receiving this distinction, we chose our class leaders.

We were now allowed to leave the drafting boards for brief periods in order to investigate our surroundings. We were amazed to find a newly painted building with freshly tiled floors, many bulletin boards, a loud-speaker system in the cafeteria, an additional smoker, and, surprisingly enough, four hundred other sketches also wandering about the premises. We occasionally got in each other's way, but we learned to enjoy the companionship. This congeniality was especially apparent on such occasions as the week-long observance of the Centennial of Salem Normal School and Teachers College at the all-college assembly on October 5. President-emeritus Edward A. Sullivan, a noted orator, was the featured speaker at this family celebration. Even the birthday cake was not forgotten on this happy anniversary.

Classes assumed priority, but we managed to take an active part in the social functions at Salem. This created a special problem for those architects who wished to make sure of our flexibility. The problem was solved satisfactorily, as was evidenced by our record attendance at the Celestial Ball sponsored by Council on December 10, the first annual Christmas Party in Chapel Hall on December 16, and the large Freshman membership in clubs and athletic associations.

Displaying exceptional athletic ability were the Freshman members of the men's basketball squad: John Kapnis, Jack Keaveny, Jim Burns, and Peter Doyle. Active in women's sports were Eileen Flynn and Janet Shmaruk. Social distinction was also achieved when Mary Daniele and Maureen Lombard were chosen as Freshman members of the Queen's Court at the Stardust Ball on January 21.

All two hundred and thirty-six of us were drawn as individuals and had thus far been performing as such. It was time for cooperation! Our first concerted move was to raise \$100 to be donated to the Salem Rotary Club for its Christmas fund. Another display of cooperation came in March when we dispersed from the drafting boards to solicit for a new building for Salem's campus. This display of college spirit was a successful factor in the allotment of funds by the Legislature. Our architects were proud of the progress we were making and were eager to see improvements in the initial sketches. At this stage progress reports were sent out.

Early in April we honored President Meier, on the first anniversary of his installation. Because of his untiring efforts, many improvements were apparent, among them the redecoration of the building and the initiating of an archives department to preserve valuable college records.

Although we were the newest members, we were invited to send a delegate to the Student Council conference in New York, sponsored by the Eastern States Association. We chose Peter Di Mento. Our basketball team won the N. E. Teachers College Conference championship title, with Peter Doyle leading the squad to victory. The newly formed Circle-K was officially recognized in May; also in May came the mammoth W.A.A. banquet.

Signs of our completion as first drafts were evident in our actions. We were hosts and hostesses to our parents on Sunday, April 24, at the Freshman Reception, our first social function as a class. On May 13 came a function of equal importance, the semi-formal, "Spring Magic," with Jimmy Mosher furnishing the music.

A further display of our ability was revealed to the entire student body on March 15, when the Freshman Talent Show was presented at an all-college assembly. Enthusiastic applause rang out as the Freshmen took their bows.

In May, more than fifty Salem Teachers College students appeared before the Essex County Legislators Association at the State House to stress Salem's need for a new building. We were proud that the Freshmen had a part in this crusade.

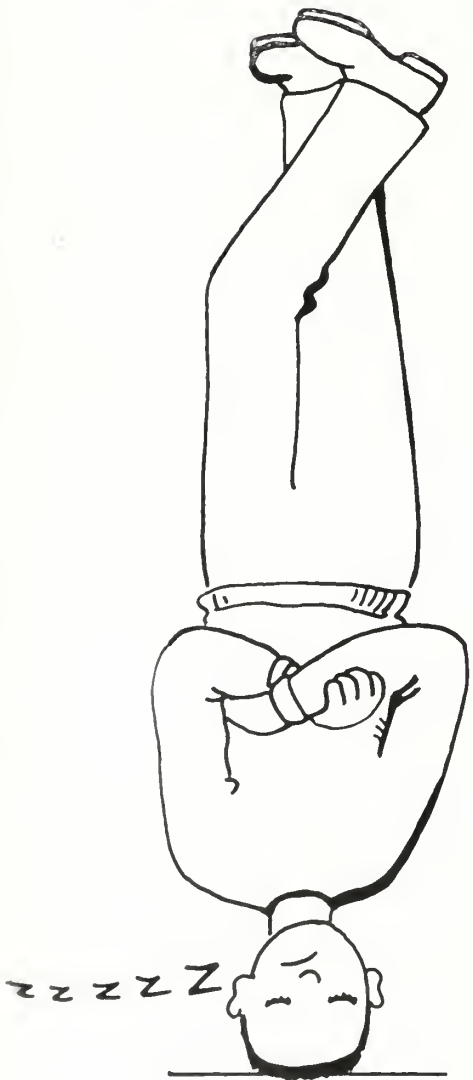
We realized that our first year was coming to an end, and we were increasingly aware that the preliminary sketches were nearing completion also. We looked forward to getting off the drafting boards.

A FIRM FOUNDATION

The preliminary sketches had been made, and the foundation was now to be laid. This being our second year at Salem, we were taken from the drafting board. Ground breaking began with the election of new leaders. There were many new sketches on the boards in our places, and we felt slightly superior.

For the first time, Junior High School specialization was offered in three fields: English-history, math-science, social studies. Many of us chose one of these combinations, the rest remaining in elementary or business curricula. Our choices were important in establishing foundations on which to build.

An essential component of the firmness of any foundation is leadership. We strengthened our leadership by taking new arrivals through the phases of initiation which we had endured the preceding year. Our treasury was increased at this time by persuading every freshman to buy a beanie. Our leadership was firmly established at the Initiation Banquet in October, which was noteworthy for an all-time attendance high of 730 students and a majority of the faculty. Salem High School gymnasium was the setting, and entertainment followed in the auditorium.

Our prestige was further increased when Salem offered the Master's degree through extension courses. Even at this early stage, some of our members were looking ahead to the time when they would be working for the advanced degree. Publicity of a favorable nature was afforded through the "S.T.C. Spotlight" columns in the Salem *News*. General interest was aroused in regard to the physical needs of the College. Senator John F. Kennedy addressed us in November and expressed interest in our building program.

Kappa Delta Phi, the General Welfare Committee of Council, and the Council as a whole made funds possible to decorate and furnish a student lounge, an improvement which was thoroughly appreciated by the entire College.

In addition to a wealth of academic ingredients, a foundation needs talent. Our class offered this in the quarter, the Four Sharps, composed of Mary Daniele, Claire Leonard, Carol Iwanicki, and Patricia Sheppard. The group walked off with top honors at a quartet contest held in Chapel Hall. Social activities contributed their share to the ingredients being mixed for a firm foundation. Many attended the very successful annual Christmas Party on December 15, and even more danced at the Council Formal to the music of Johnny Gould's orchestra.

Several of our group had won honors since their departure from the drafting boards. At the W.A.A. semi-formal, "Roman Holiday," on February 10, Betty Chaggaris and Dorothy Thomas were chosen for the Queen's Court. Annette Turla and Raye Claffey, associate editors of the *Log*, were delegates to the Columbia Scholastic Press Association Conference at New York in March. Another Sophomore who gained recognition was Jack Looney, who won the Salem Rotary Club Essay Contest.

Determination is a necessary attribute in the formation of every individual. We of the Class of 1958 were determined to become master teachers. To scale our progress, we allowed ourselves to be tested by our architects in order to find out how we compared with similar constructions in progress throughout the country. Needless to say, as a result of these Sophomore Examinations, our determination deepened. We then decided to obtain a symbol of this, and we ordered class rings, which were, for the first time, standardized as to color and design. Henceforth we could recognize members of our Alma Mater by this symbol.

The elements in our foundation began to appear slightly off balance; there was a definite need for more social elements, so we sponsored the "Bar-None Jamboree" on April 13, with Fred Scott, caller, and the Bill Duley orchestra. Although we were older, our athletic prowess was undiminished. Both the men and women of the Sophomore Class came out on top in the intra-mural basketball tournaments. The State again evinced an interest in us, and Lieutenant-Governor Sumner Whittier came to address us in April.

All of the departments were very active as our foundation neared completion. In conjunction with our first course in methods, the Elementary and Junior High departments visited Newton to observe ideal classroom situations. The Business department was not idle at College. On April 18, Salem established the 97th chapter of Pi Omega Pi, national honor business fraternity. This chapter, Delta Alpha, was the second in New England, and Mr. Jeffery was appointed the adviser.

We were sorry to learn of the retirement of Mr. Leon Rockwell at the close of the year after thirty years of service on the staff.

In June, 1956, our staff of architects and engineers agreed that there was a sufficient supply of materials for the first stage of actual construction. These were synthesized and moulded into form. Our mentors also agreed that there should be a rest period, in order to allow this foundation to become firmer before the framework was erected on it. All members of the Sophomore Class were in complete agreement, and they scattered in all directions to enjoy two months of needed relaxation.

THE FRAMEWORK

A framework is "the constructional system that gives a building its model and strength. Our members having dwindled to one hundred and forty, returned to Salem on September 10, 1956, with great anticipation, hoping to build a sturdy framework on the foundation already laid. Our hopes and ambitions were furthered as each support in the framework was expertly put in place by our builders. Faculty duties increased steadily as enrollment figures reached an all-time high, and the space was at a premium, making it imperative that a new building be under construction in the immediate future.

We became Big Brothers and Sisters to those newly placed on the drafting boards. Drawing on our vast store of knowledge, we passed this test of knowledge of college procedure with superior results.

The first supports of our framework were strengthened by a greater understanding of the problems of teacher-training institutions as presented to the student body on December 4, by Dr. D. Justin McCarthy, the newly appointed Director of the Division of Teachers Colleges.

Salem's first soccer team journeyed to West Point; Junior Class members of the team were Jack Looney, Jim Leonard, and John Galaris. At the third annual Christmas Party, our Glee Clubs combined with those of Northeastern University to present an excellent program.

Dr. Adele Driscoll of the Education Department, who was to transfer to Fitchburg Teachers College at the end of the year, was honored at a tea in January, and a silver tray, suitably inscribed, was presented to her. Recognized in the *Log* for devoted service was Miss Ann K. Clark, registrar, who had completed thirty years of service to the Commonwealth. Assembly programs included a demonstration of glassblowing, and Council bought the glass ship which we saw made.

Increased costs deferred the construction of the new building, and our dreams remained unrealized. Chemistry was offered in the curriculum for the first time in twenty years, and Salem was a leader in recognizing the new place of science in the curriculum.

The proof of the sturdiness of our framework was to come with our greatest ordeal, practice teaching, when we came face to face with the "whole child." For this training, an unusual amount of patience on the part of the architects was necessary, as our professional attitude developed further.

Pleased with a measure of academic and training success, the members of the Class of 1958 again looked to social pleasures. A cake sale swelled our coffers. The Junior Carnival will never be forgotten by all who participated in making it a success, or by the patrons who saw Chapel Hall transformed into a playground for the young in heart. Pulchritude was not neglected. Dorothy Thomas and Georgia Perry were members of the Queen's Court at the W.A.A. "Midnight Whirl" on February 15.

The roof may be said to have been put on the framework during the glorious week of April 22-26 — Junior Week. Bertram Berube and his committee took the class "Around The World in Eighty Days," to a roller skating party, to a weenie roast in Nahant, and on a mystery ride. Climaxing the week's festivities was the Junior Prom, "A String of Pearls," held in the Princess Room of the Hotel Somerset in Boston. Ken Reeves furnished the music for a delightful evening of dancing.

It was difficult to concentrate on academic work after such a week, but we managed to settle down until Class Day and Commencement, at which events Juniors participated in Move-Up Exercises, as members of the Laurel and Daisy Chains, and as Ushers and Marshals. Chosen as Marshals at Senior Investiture in April were André Thibodeau and Dorothy Thomas.

On Class Day, June 5, 1957, we realized that our third stage of construction had been completed, and that our framework was sturdy and capable of withstanding all assaults. It was as sound as our foundation, giving us an unlimited supply of intellectual strength. 1956-1957 was one of our most successful years.

Our last initiation banquet was crowded with never-to-be-forgotten memories. We were now fully aware of the wonderful times we had experienced together at Salem.

When equipping a building both the decorative and the practical must be considered. In the building of an individual this is also true, but the equipment is of a different sort. Integrity, resourcefulness, patience, and understanding go into the equipping of a good teacher. Originality is prized. All of this equipment was to be evaluated during first semester, as each member of the Elementary and Junior High departments went out to his respective community to face his first independent teaching experience. Patience was truly recognized as a virtue of cardinal importance, and originality was revealed where hitherto unsuspected. *Scuttlebut*, a news sheet, kept the Seniors in training aware of college matters, conveying information otherwise unobtainable. This was another "First" for our Class.

In the fall our dreams were fulfilled, as we saw ground broken for the new building. Construction, so long awaited, would soon be under way. Ground-breaking ceremonies took place on November 7, when Mrs. Alice M. Lyons, chairman of the Board of Education, assisted by Commissioner Owen B. Kiernan, turned a spadeful of earth. Members of the Legislature, municipal officers, alumni, faculty and students participated in the ceremonies.

Ground breaking for the CLIPPER took place as soon as College opened in September. The CLIPPER'S first project was the Hoedown, a profitable one which enabled the staff to open a bank account. The sale of green carnations on St. Patrick's Day also helped to defray expenses.

As another "first" at Salem, the students were given the experience of watching closed-circuit TV. This demonstration was extremely interesting, and the value of the device in the classroom was obvious.

Every member of the Senior Class was imbued with the spirit of fun, frolic, and free fancy when he stepped into the spotlight on November 25 and 26. "College Capers," a musical extravaganza, sponsored by the Senior Class was written by Maxine Smith, Arline Timmons, and Frank Lojudice, and directed by Dorothy Thomas, assisted by Bill Russell. All members of the cast received wide acclaim for their talented performances.

Amidst interviews with superintendents who wished to check the extent of our fitness for teaching positions and the continued striving for academic excellence, we still found time for social activities. The highlight of our spring season was the first Senior Dinner Dance on March 20, at beautiful Spraycliff Inn, in Marblehead. Who will ever forget the unexpected snowstorm that night?

Our architects were completely satisfied with the success of their efforts, and in April we were given the right to wear academic garb. Dick Connors made a fine address to the Seniors at these Investiture Ceremonies in Chapel Hall. This was the beginning of the end, and as Dr. Meier capped each Senior a certain sadness tinged this ceremony.

A Spring Fashion Show on May 7 helped to fill our treasury, soon to be depleted by Commencement expenses, and on June 2 we began our final week as Seniors at Salem Teachers College. We initiated the week by holding our Senior Reception at the Thompson Club in Nahant. This gala occasion was quickly followed by Class Day activities on June 4, and at Commencement Exercises on June 8 came the climax of our college career.

Thus have our four years of work and pleasure come to a close. We shall be ever grateful to our architects and engineers for building us into well-equipped teachers, ready to face the "whole child" with the proper professional attitude. 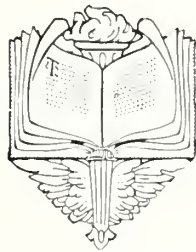
