The Afro-American Society of Salem State College will announce today their decisions concerning acceptability of statements issued by the Administration, Faculty Senate Executive Board, and the Student Government in answer to the Valer Day Black Manifesto of Salem State College, put out by that society Wednesday. Statements made by three governing bodies of this college follow over ten hours of discussion which were held last Thursday and Friday with the Afro-American Society at open meetings in the College Union. The Manifesto consisted of demands, from academics and faculty facilities.

good Day...

Today Salem State College administration, faculty senate, and Student Association are sponsoring a series of meetings to discuss "The Future of Salem State College."

All classes have been cancelled for the day.

The objective of "Dialogue Day (or "D-Day," as it will be called) will be to assess possible effects of the so-called "Academic Master Plan" on SSC, within the context of the Massachusetts State College System.

The draft "Master Plan" suggests among other changes, the elimination of duplications in degree programs offered by different colleges; the consolidation of associate degrees; a major policy concern is transferring from one college to another within the college system; and the methods of earning

The College Board of Trustees will assess the desirability and feasibility of implementing the existing draft Master Plan after all the state colleges have submitted their evaluations of it to them.

STUDENTS TO FUND SOUTH CAMPUS BUS

The meetings began last Thursday when a representative body of administrators, executive members of the faculty, and state government officials met with the Afro-American Society. President Keegan, speaking for the administration, stated the need to deal as realistically as possible, adding that he did not want to "tread on toes." President Keegan presided at the mass meeting in the auditorium the day before as "a good beginning in solving racial problems on this campus." Steve Dickerson, speaking for the Afro-Am Society, stated that the meeting held Wednesday (triggered by the "Slave Auction" held in the dorm) was not a good thing in that the auction

BASKETBALL

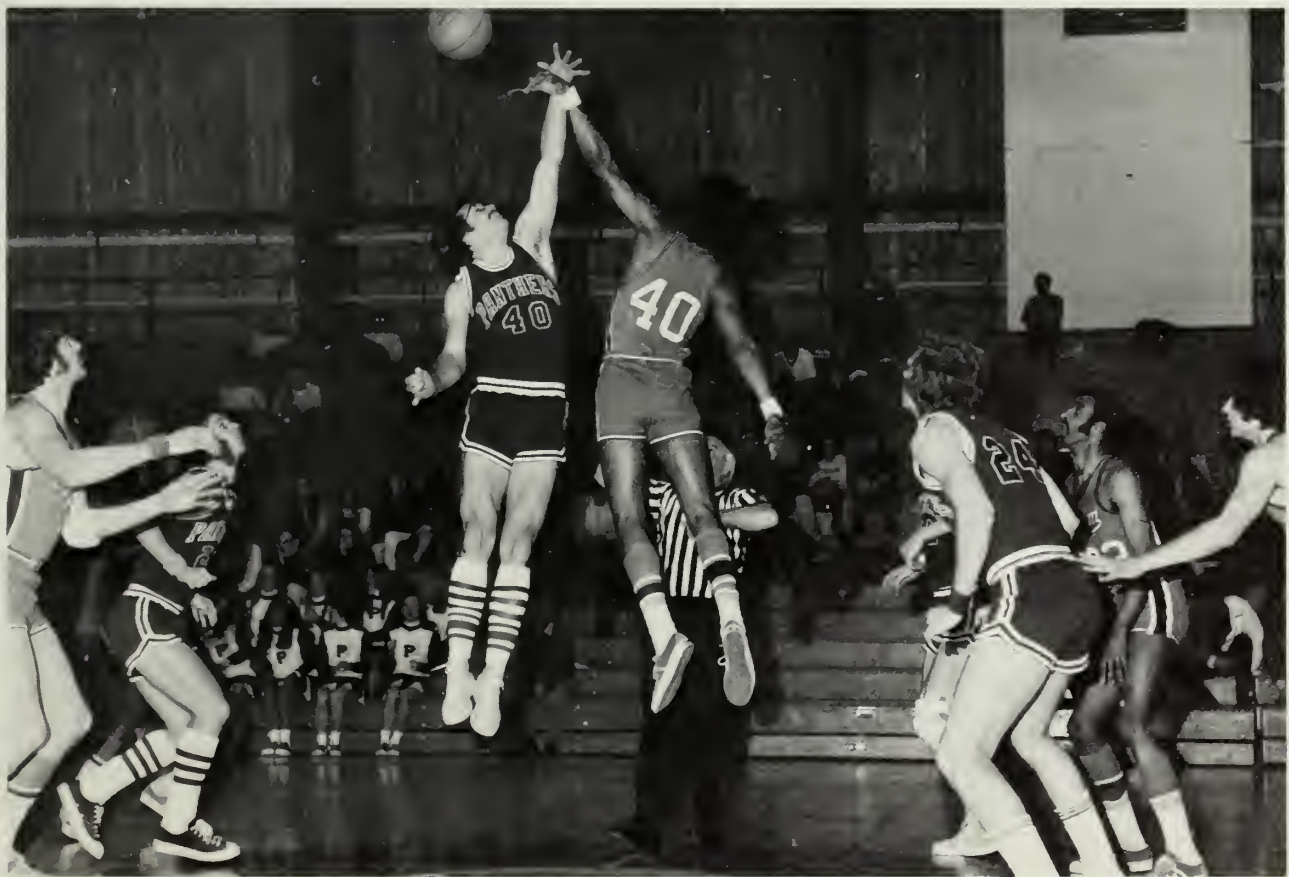
The Salem State Viking basketball team finished its 1972-1973 season with a creditable 11-9 record. This is quite an improvement over last year's 7-12 mark. The team was only 2-5 before its schedule was interrupted with a months lay-off in December and January due to exams and vacation. From January on, they finished with a 9-4 slate.

"The team got outstanding performances from Curt Clemons, Steve Grace, and Kim Carpentier. Bob Burns, along with Tony Borgasano, was the steadying influence in the backcourt."

First year head coach, Joe Lavacchia, had some thoughts on the season. "At the start we knew that with the loss of Bob Goodwill and Paul Stechinfinger we would be inexperienced, especially in the front court. We had an up and down year, with an excellent second half. The surge after the month of inactivity was most likely a result of gained experience and getting used to playing with one another."

HOCKEY

The Salem State College Viking hockey team concluded its 1972-73 season with a 10-9 record. It was an up and down year as the team played in streaks all season.

There were many bright spots during the year. First of all, head coach, Barry Urbanski, won his 100th coaching career win to rank with one of the highest winning percentages among E.C.A.C. Division II coaches. His record over nine years is 100-56-4.

Coach Urbanski commenting on this season said, "inexperience and our inability to score hurt us this year. Also, we had many defensive lapses. The loss of Co-Captain Bob Fitzgerald with mononucleosis for the first half of the year hurt us. The biggest loss was that of Co-Captain and defenseman Bill Fahey with a broken knee cap. After his return we were more aggressive and played better hockey. He was an inspiration to the team."

The last two games, against Bowdoin and U. Mass., showed we can compete with the "Iron" of Division II. The players know now they can beat the best.









GOLF

The 1972 Fall Golf Season started out with an undefeated season: 4 wins plus finishing runner-up for the second year in a row in the E.C.A.C. Regionals at Dartmouth College (tied with Harvard). This finish allowed the team to compete at Cooperstown, New York, in which they placed seventh among the East Coast Golf Teams.

Some highlights of the SSC Golf Team's season were the winning of the Massachusetts State College Athletic Conference at Vespa Country Club in Tyingsboro for the second straight year. In this competition, Bob Dyer finished as Medalist for the Day. On May 11th we received the runner-up plaque for the N.A.I.A. Tournament. The SSC Golf Team finished third in the N.E.I.T.; with Scott Pryor receiving a silver tray for the college by placing 2nd in a field of 240 golfers. This was the best showing any SSC team has ever made.

We completed our season by once again being selected as a representative for the N.C.A.A. of District I for the 5th year in a row. The tournament was held at the home course in Riverside, California. Salem finished 19th out of 28 teams.

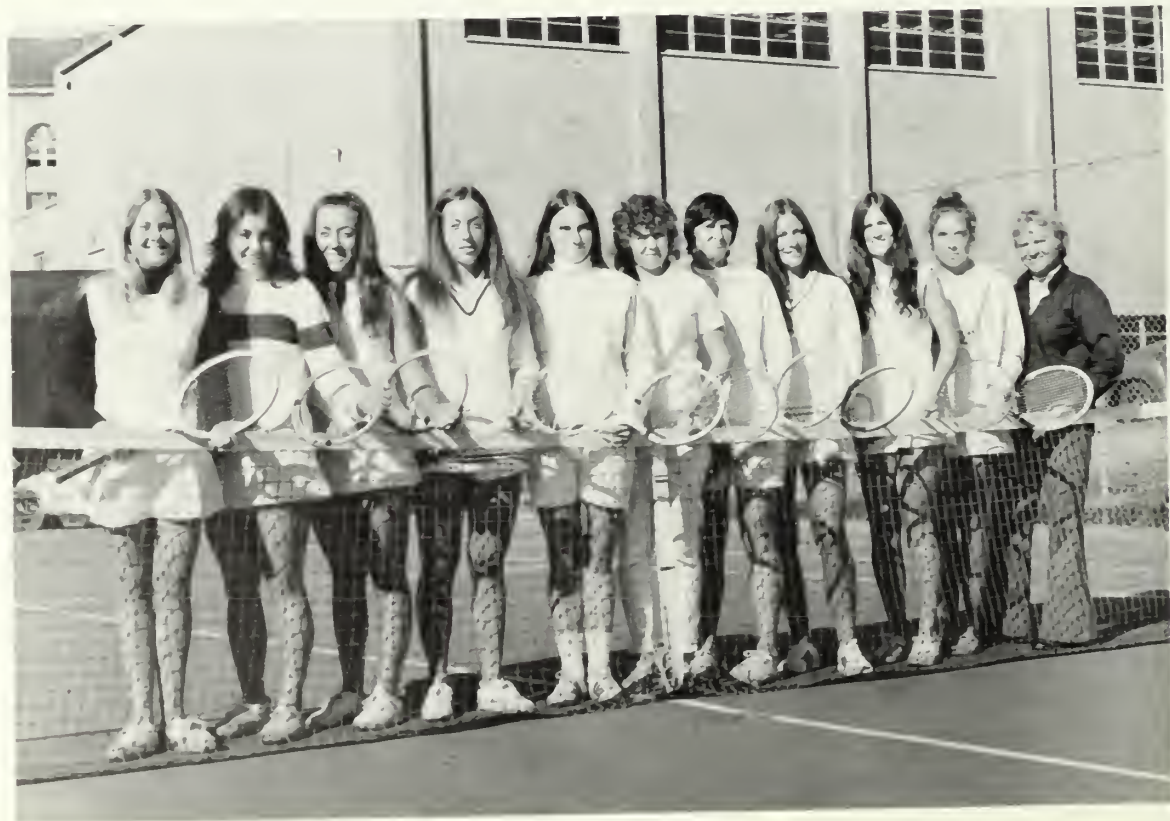

After being bridesmaid for the past three years Salem State Varsity Tennis Team finally was able to win the N.A.I.A. District 32 Tennis Tournament. This was the culmination of one of the most successful sports seasons in Salem's history. Led by returning letterman, Ken Rickson, Paul Bergesen and Mike McQuade, the team breezed through their first nine opponents finally losing to the University of Maine, then winning the final four matches of the season for an overall record of thirteen wins and one loss.

In addition to winning the N.A.I.A. tournament at the end of the season, the Salem netmen also won the M.A.S.C.A.C. Tournament. The highlight of the season was the trip to Kansas for the National Tournament.







TRACK

Salem State College did an outstanding job this past Spring, winning 8 and losing 3. Coach Gillis feels that if he had some distance runners, the season would have been 10-1. The meet at Lowell Tech. was lost by the mile relay and the meet against Worcester was lost by only 15 points.

The outstanding performers for SSC were; Dick Krisko, Manny DeCruz, Tom Holak, Glenn Jefferson, Dave Hurley, Bob Murphy, Scott Gillis, Vin Gennari, Richard Cox, Bill Mazerall, Dave Gurin and Steve Ferraro.

Dick Krisko, a junior from Peabody was awarded the "Most Valuable" trophy at the Spring banquet. Dick has another year left and was outstanding in the pole vault, 440 intermediate hurdles and the 440 relay.

Robert Murphy, a Junior who captained the team with Dick Krisko, had an excellent year in the weight event establishing a school record in the hammer.

Manny DeCruz was a surprise, winning the high jump consistently, anchoring the mile relay team, and running the 440. Manny's best performance came in the N.A.I.A. meet where he jumped 6'5" to win the high jump.

Coach Gillis stated that he has nothing but respect and pride for his team for their performance on and off the track last Spring. The team accomplished their achievements without a track and their attitude was outstanding.





BASEBALL

Salem State College Baseball Team, under Coach Joe Lavacchia, had one of its most successful teams in recent years. The team finished with a record of 17 wins and only 3 losses. While compiling this most impressive won-loss record the team won the Massachusetts State College Conference Championship, with a league record of 13 wins and 3 losses, and was selected to participate in the N.A.I.A. playoffs for the second consecutive year.

A major factor for the teams success was the outstanding hitting of veterans Bill Fahey, Tony Giordano, Artie Krikorian, Captain Jack Cavanagh, and newcomer Butch Murray. For most of the season the team was ranked in the top ten in the country in hitting. On an individual note, Salem's Bill Fahey, after leading the country for most of the year, ended the season as the number eight hitter in the country among small college players.

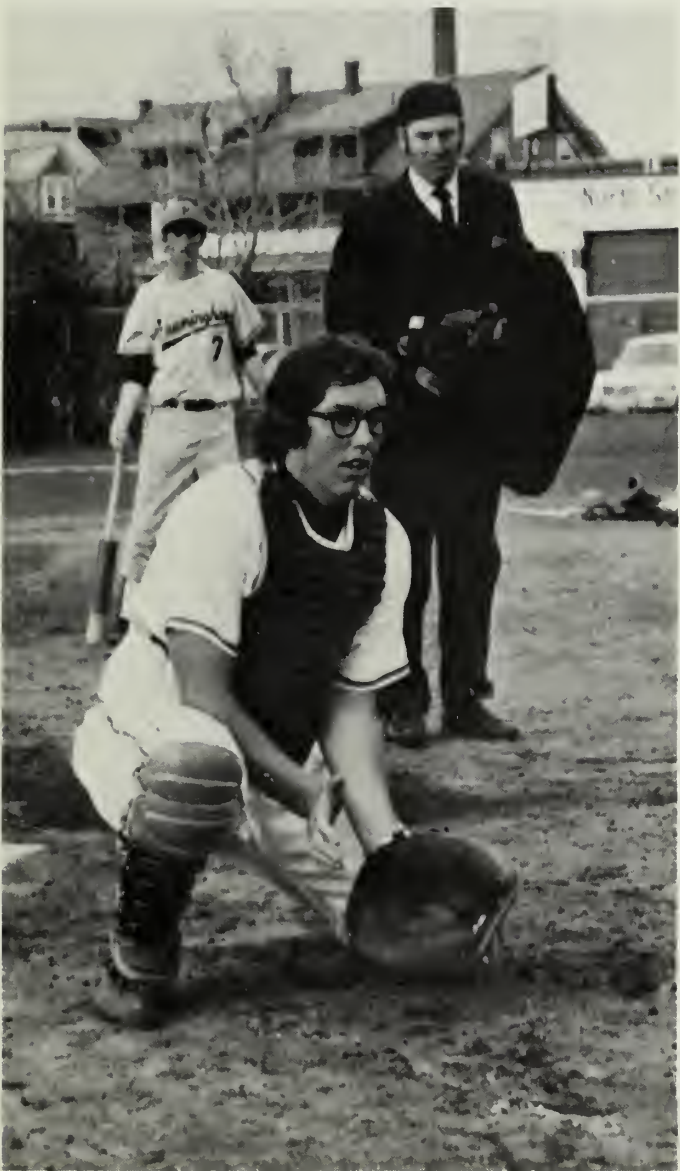

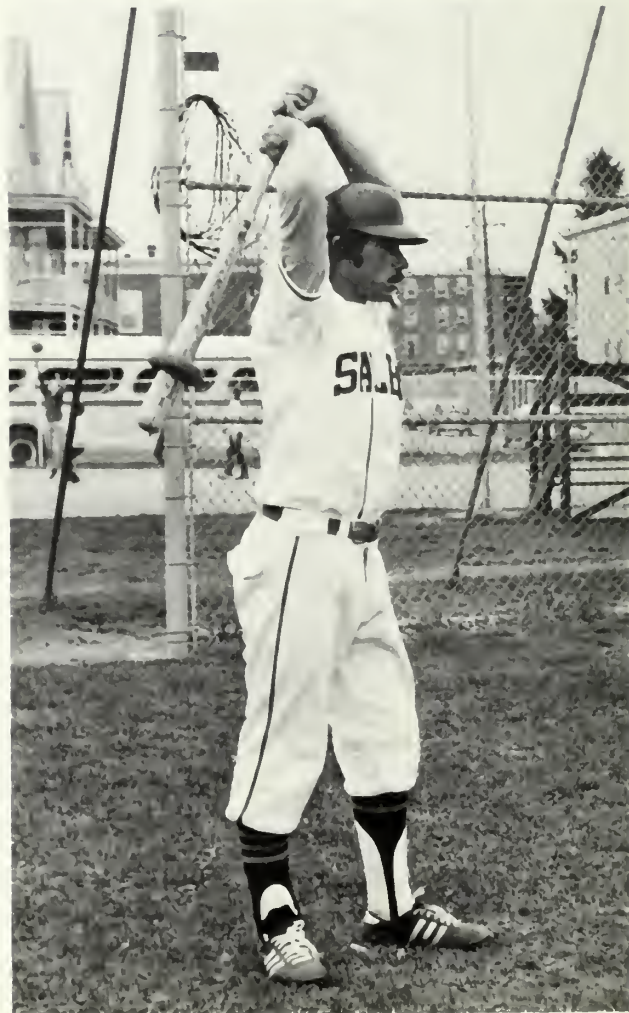

This includes a New England State College Championship, a Massachusetts State College Championship, and two invitations to the N.A.I.A. playoffs.

Several of the players received recognition. Bill Fahey was named to the district all star team, and the league all star team. Tony Giordano was a member of the district and league all star team. Jack Cavanagh was also named to the district tournament team.





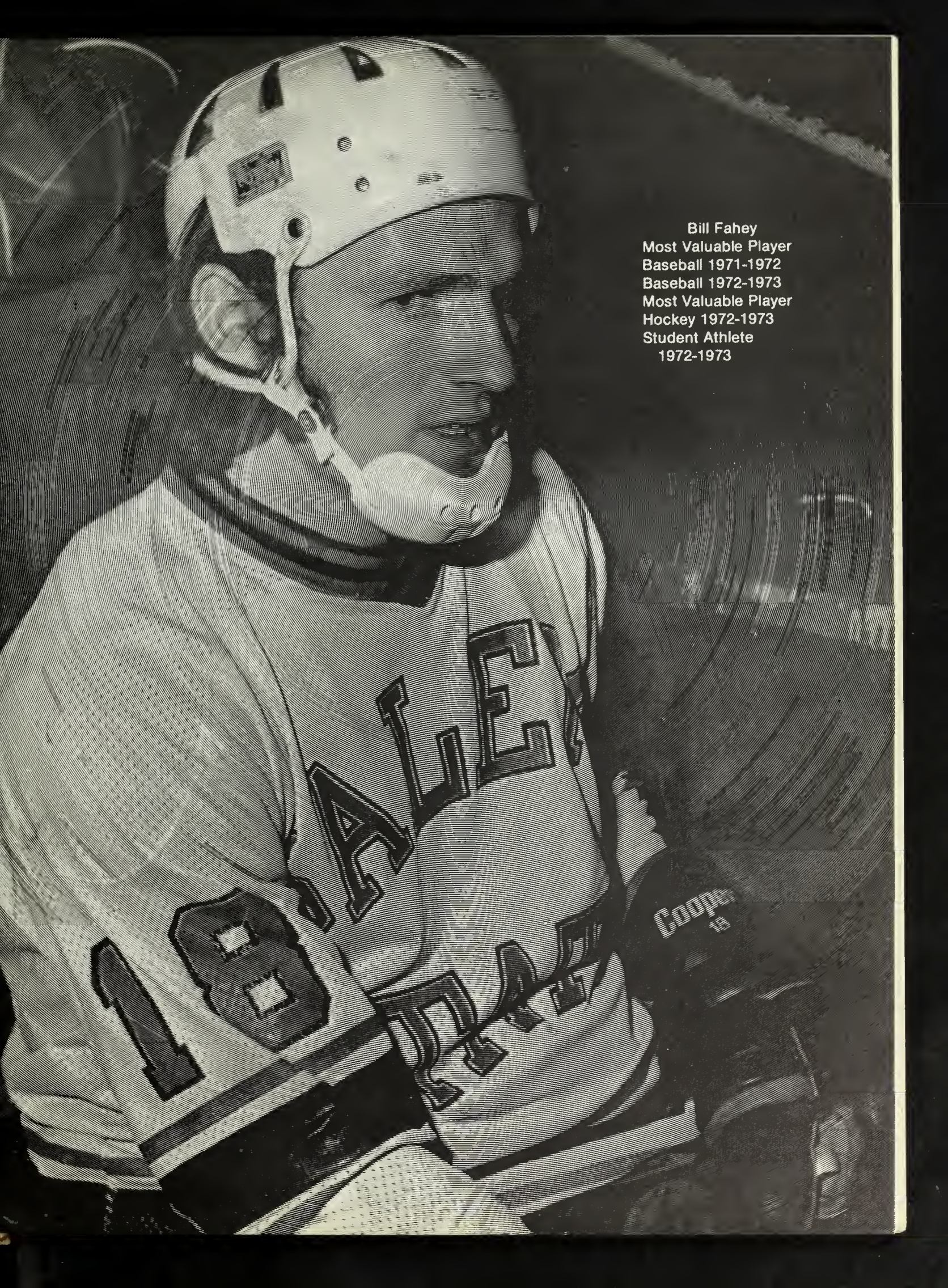
