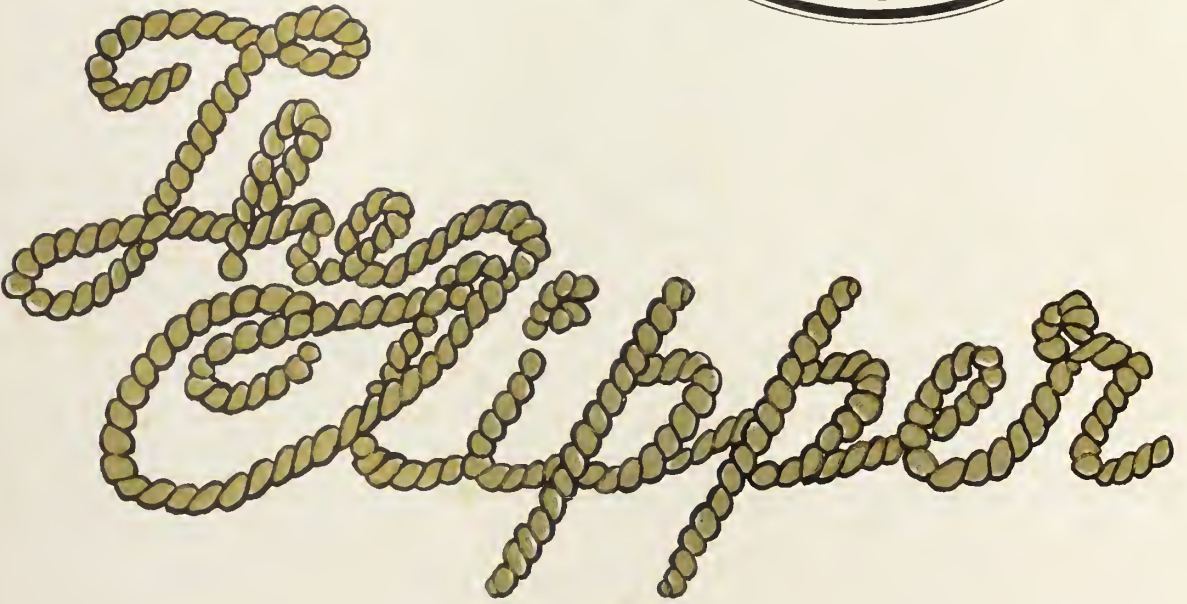

May I wish you all true success in your quest to create in the young a hunger for knowledge and understanding. The college is pleased with the record of the Class of 1960; return often to visit us.

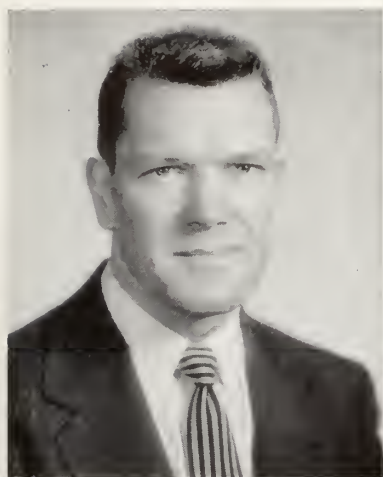

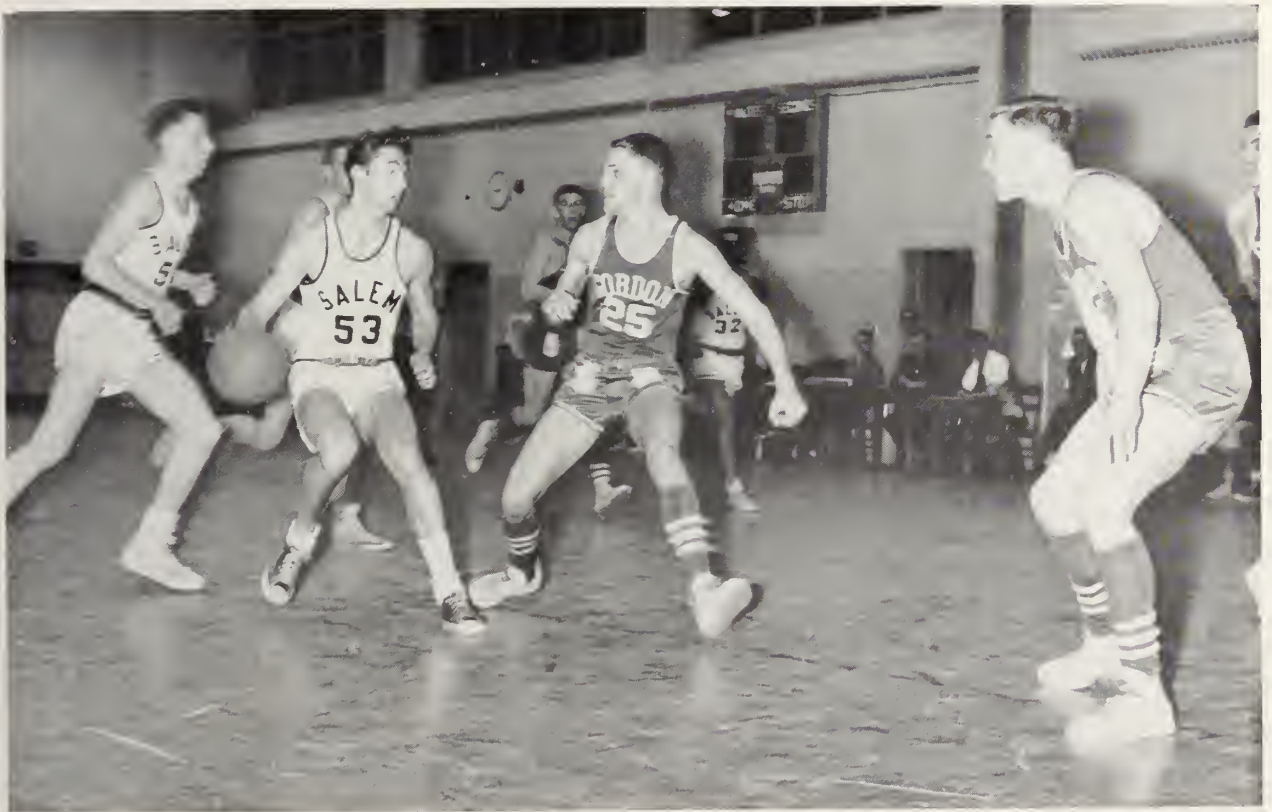
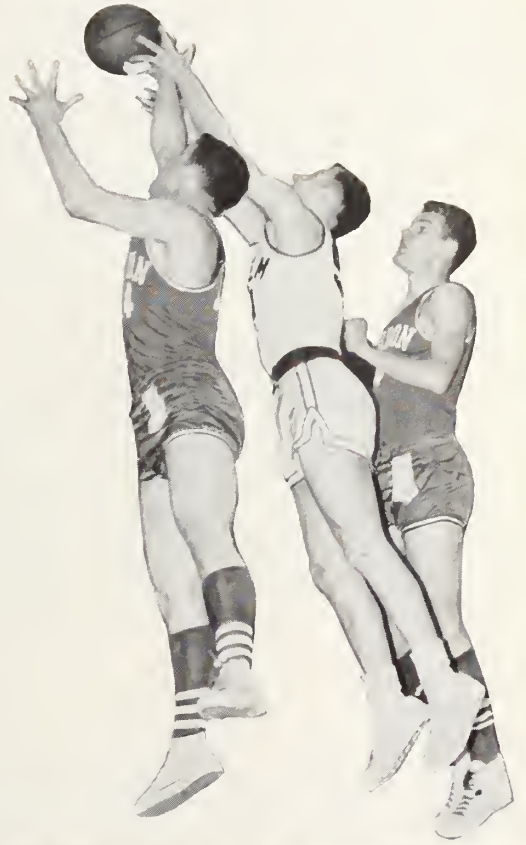


M.A.A. EXPANDS

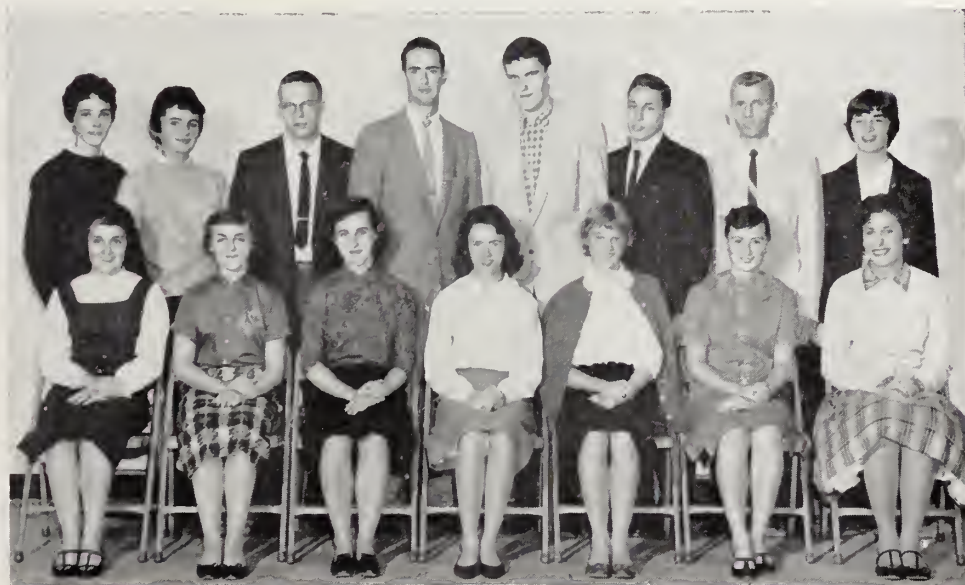
