I've made a resolution upon my return from leave that I would answer more promptly all the grand letters I receive from you. Today I read your latest. As you say it was unfortunate that we couldn't have been together for a little longer discussion. I had hoped to see you at the College but luck was again mine.

I had a fairly decent trip across the country. Left Boston 12 noon Sun. Apr. 16, ar. in Balt. 0830 that nite; left Balt. at 11:45 same nite and ar. in Chi. at 5:45 Mon. nite. Had 5 $\frac{1}{2}$ hr. layover in Chi. and left for Seattle at 11:15. Ar. in Seattle right on time the morning of the 30th.

Am now departing this area for "destination unknown". Am not sorry to get underway again. Spend too much money on a lib. in these West Coast towns - \$8-20 a nite - believe it or not.

Lots of work and lots of drilling from now on. We have new equipment and many boats aboard so we'll be drilling ourselves to sleep. Oh for the quiet nights and meditative moments of a philosopher. Write soon again. Give my best to the family and all at Salem.
