WHAT IS THE HOLOCAUST CENTER?

HISTORY: The Holocaust Center, Boston North Inc. was created in 1982 to provide community awareness, information, audio-visual support, and education about the Nazi Holocaust in an attempt to prevent this history from repeating itself. The goal is to reduce hatred, prejudice, ignorance and indifference through education. The Holocaust Center is a non-profit organization overseen and advised by an interfaith board.

RESOURCES: The Holocaust Center is staffed Monday through Friday, 10 A.M. - 2 P.M. during the school year, and is housed at the Peabody Institute Library's Center for the Study of Human Rights, 82 Main St., Peabody. During regular library hours, more than 2000 books and over 100 videos for all ages are available for loan and the Gallery of Student Art can be viewed.

SPEAKERS' BUREAU: Survivors, witnesses, and historians.

PROGRAMS: The Holocaust Center provides programs and awareness sessions for the community including public and private schools, organizations, churches, and temples.

ORAL HISTORIES: The Holocaust Center is an affiliate of the Fortunoff Video Archives for Holocaust Testimonies at Yale University. To date, 100+ oral histories, used only for education, have been recorded.

SURVIVORS' CONFERENCE: The annual forum for survivors, their children, and grandchildren to share their experiences and discuss relevant issues was held at Facing History on 10/01/03.

HUMAN RIGHTS AWARENESS CONFERENCE: For High School students, grades 9-12 to increase awareness of past and present violations of human rights. Attendance has been to capacity of 800. Held 11/05/04 with **ERNEST RUGWIZANGONGA**, a Rwandan Survivor; **JOSEPH MATZNER**, a Holocaust Survivor; and **SEYON SOEUN**, Cambodian Genocide Survivor.

KRISTALLNACHT COMMEMORATION was held on 11/16/04 with a presentation of the original educational video, *Present Memories*, and discussion with the six survivors featured in the video. Co-sponsored by NSCC.

PROGRAMMING FOR FIFTH/SIXTH GRADES Many area elementary students were introduced to the Holocaust and the application of the lessons of this period to present day. The program includes discussion on the effects of stereotyping, scapegoating, ethnic jokes, name-calling, the swastika, etc.
