## MASCAC Athletes Compete For 14 Championships

The Massachusetts State College Athletic Conference (MASCAC) was formed in 1971 with the primary purpose to provide a uniform program of athletics for all state colleges. The objective underlying this purpose was to create a healthy atmosphere of competition and rivalry between the colleges and their student bodies while fostering the values of cooperation, leadership, courage, self-discipline, and self reliance among the participating athletes.

### The Howard C. Smith Cup

The Howard C. Smith Cup is named in honor of the former Massachusetts State College Trustee who, in 1970, encouraged the state college's athletic directors to hold a series of meetings to form an intercollegiate athletic conference. In June of 1971, an affirmative agreement was reached and the Massachusetts State College Athletic Conference (MASCAC) became a reality.

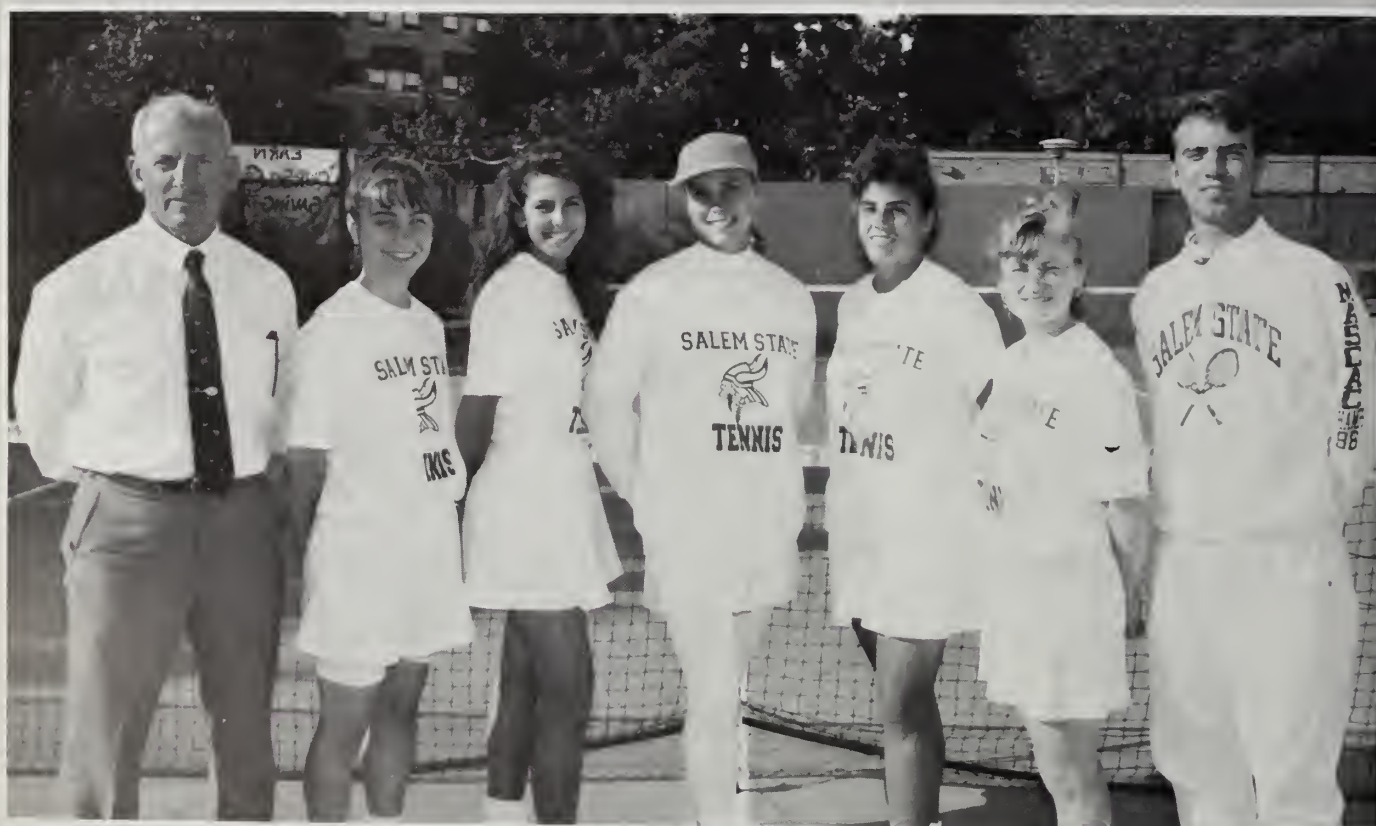
During the MASCAC's initial year of existence, its charter member colleges (Boston, Bridgewater, Fitchburg, Framingham, Mass. Maritime, North Adams, Salem, Westfield and Worcester) voted to award a "Cup" annually to the institution which compiles the most points based on the placement of each of its teams in the 14 conference championships.

Thus, the Howard C. Smith Cup was established in honor of Trustee Smith for his trailblazing effort in convincing the Massachusetts State College system to form its own intercollegiate athletic conference.
